It is our utmost desire as an organisation attending to the needs of young people of Sierra Leone, particularly in education to make it clear that it is intolerable for a developing nation to go through this untimely, unnecessary, misleading and pathetic act that is being allegedly carried out by some leaders in our society. It goes without saying that if there is no strong desire to acquire valuable and genuine education the future of our country is at stake.

Amongst the most serious repercussions of this incautious act by a handful of Sierra Leoneans relates to painting a very gloomy future and mockery of our academia, exposure to unfair questioning by outside institutions of Sierra Leonean students, defrauding deserving and hard-working people of their merited jobs and horrendously normalising impersonation and academic fraud in our society. at home and abroad with genuine degrees will be exposed to harsh treatment and "elements of suspicion" which brings the nation into disrepute on all levels.

Against the backdrop of a government that identifies itself with quality education as its flagship endeavour, this "degreegate" revelation has the tendency to sabotage the gains made in the sector and questions the viability of its flagship programme if stringent actions are not taken. We require that the Government should inform the entire nation of their plan to address this issue and ensure that the future of our youth and the jobs they are genuinely entitled to are protected. We should not wait to be judged by posterity.
